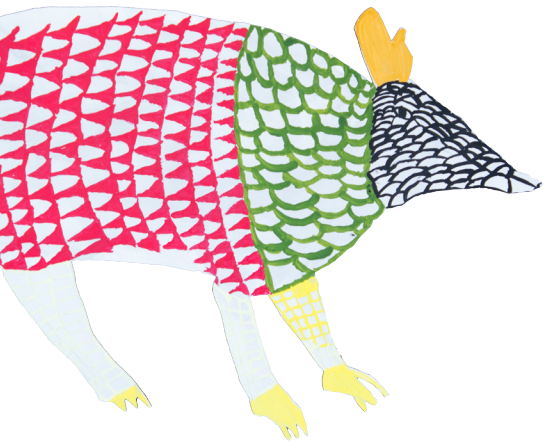

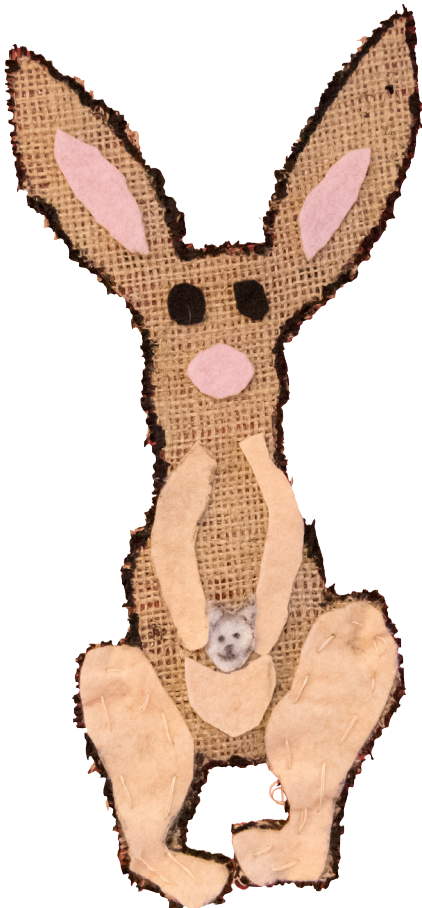

FINANCIAL AID

Diversity is at the core of The Foote School's mission and philosophy. Financial aid strengthens economic and social diversity in our community. It also provides access to a Foote education to qualified students who might not otherwise be able to meet the cost of tuition. Approximately 25 percent of our students are receiving more than \$1.9 million in need-based financial aid, with grants ranging from \$500 to nearly full tuition.
